Glass Vase of Flowers and Fruit (detail) h. 1668 Colección Masaveu Still-life pictures are one of the most coherent groups of artworks in the Masaveu Collection in terms of both number and quality. This exhibition brings together a significant selection focused on the most outstanding Baroque and Enlightenment pieces in order to provide a representative overview of the origin and development of one of the most widespread subjects in the tradition of Western art.

The selection also includes pictures from the Fundación María Cristina Masaveu Peterson's own holdings as well as from the Pedro Masaveu Peterson Collection (consisting of four hundred and ten works). His personal collection was donated to the Principality of Asturias in lieu of payment in 1994, a year after his death, on the express instructions of María Cristina Masaveu Peterson, who wished to honour her brother's role as a collector. Since 1996 these pieces have been on view at the Museo de Bellas Artes de Asturias, regarded since then as one of Spain's leading provincial art museums. This show therefore marks a welcome reencounter of artworks, most of which were acquired to form the same thematic group.

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The exhibition traces the development of the still-life genre, for which Spanish has a distinctive term, *bodegón*. This is the name given to paintings that portray objects, fruits, animals or flowers very close up, paying attention to their different textures and appearance. These pictures of seemingly trivial subjects, which first arose in learned environments, later became popular with other wealthy social classes in the 17th century on account of their huge visual appeal. In contrast to history paintings or religious images, the sight of selected pieces of still liferendered with astonishing realism broadened spectators' horizons.

Divided into three sections, the show surveys the evolution of this theme in the main Spanish centres of artistic production throughout much of the Early Modern Age. Through paintings by the most famous practitioners of the genre in their day, such as Juan de Zurbarán, Arellano and Meléndez, the Masaveu Collection guides today's viewers on a journey across a century and a half of Spanish *bodegones*.
